


Parents' association News

Safety at St Luke's

Despite our small school site, we benefit from using the facilities at St Luke's regularly. Parents may like to know how the school mitigates the risks of being in a public place so often.

- The children are accompanied by a suitable number of adults.
- Adults wear high visibility vests, and stand in the road and at the front and back of the line when crossing
- Pupils are expected to walk silently and safely, lining up in a set order to maintain routine and discipline
- When in the pitches, the gates are closed and a mealtime supervisor waits by each gate
- Children are accompanied to the toilet, and toilets are checked by an adult to ensure they are empty
- Adults take mobile phones and first aid kits with them
- A register is taken on the children's return
