Thank you for your hard work and professionalism in producing such high standards and congratulations again to you and your staff for all you have achieved.



Our last day of term is Thursday March 29th, and school will finish at 1.30pm, following our parent consultation and agreement from governors.

It is important that the routines and expectations surrounding this change are made clear from the outset, therefore we ask that you please note the following points carefully:

- All classes will be registered at 1.20pm and dismissed from the hall in the usual way at 1.30pm.
- Please do not arrive early at the office, requesting for your child to leave before lunch. Afternoon absence will not be authorised.
