Latin

completion of *Minimus – starting out in Latin* to begin *Minimus Secundus* where they meet their first past tense (the imperfect e.g. portabam 'I was carrying') and other forms of the verb. Case structure is still limited to the nominative and the accusative.
A key aim of the Minimus course is to teach English grammar through simple Latin. Work on parts of speech, vocabulary patterns, links with other languages, derivations, prefixes and suffixes are integral to Minimus lessons.
