Juniors' Sports Day Wednesday 25th June


Our Juniors' sports day takes place on Wednesday 25th June from 9.30 until 12pm.

Chaplain's Corner - Fr James

Pentecost commemorates the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles, which occurred ten days after the Ascension, on the Jewish Feast of Pentecost—a feast that celebrated the giving of the Law to Moses on Mount Sinai. This is significant because the New Pentecost fulfills the Old: through the coming of the Holy Spirit, the New Law is established. This Law is no longer written on tablets of stone, but upon our hearts, through Baptism and Confirmation. The New Law is the Holy Spirit Himself, given to us; His action within us enables us to keep the moral law as a living expression of our love for God, and thereby conforms us to Christ, who kept the law perfectly in loving obedience to the Father.


Map Quest Fortnight

What's been going on in class this week?

Year 6

It has been a wonderful first week back after the half term break. The Year 6 children have returned with plenty of energy and have enjoyed the variety of learning that we have done - both inside and outside of the classroom. Here is a summary of what has been covered:

English: Text Focus: Windrush Child by Benjamin Zephaniah. Writing focus: Analysing and organising information from original sources. Writing informally from the perspective of a character. Drama: preparing and auditioning for end of year dramatic production!

RE: The Transforming Spirit: To understand and reflect on how the popes lead us to Jesus.

Science: Living Things & Their Habitats: Describe how living things are classified into broad groups according to common observable characteristics and based on similarities and differences. Understanding the life and work of Carl Linnaeus and the impact of the Linnaeus classification system.

Geography: Mapquest: To know and use the 8 points of the compass; To identify and locate the English counties; To use index and contents pages to find information in an atlas; To use 4 figure and 6 figure grid references; To know and understand the importance of the Prime/Greenwich meridian and how it relates to time zones; To select the most appropriate route from A to B and give directions using grid references.

PSHE: Relationships, health and sex education: understanding human reproduction.

Computing: Using digital resources to produce a presentation suited for a particular audience.

Art: Cubism - creating photorealist portraits.

Music: Waltz & School production song preparation

PE: Athletics

Next week, we will be full steam ahead with our school production rehearsals as well as our second week of Mapquest! It will also be the final week before School Journey!

Year 5

Year 5 have had a great week this week and they have been very focused for their second week of assessments. The children have also been continuing to explore the Americas for our Map Quest focus, and have been working hard towards their final quiz! Here is what else they have been up to this week:

- -In Maths, as part of a focus on 'Position and Direction', we have been reading and plotting coordinates and have been investigating translation, reflection and lines of symmetry in shapes.
- -In English, linked with our text 'Tom's Midnight Garden', we have been comparing the main character's Tom and Hattie and understanding the author's choices for these character's traits.
- -In Geography, as part of our Map Quest focus, we have been exploring the countries of South and North America. We have also been learning about 4 and 6 figure grid references.
- -In French, we have been locating cities in the countries of North and South America.
- -In PSHE, we have been looking at the risks of non-illegal and illegal drugs.
- -In PE, we have been looking forward to Sports Day, practicing our athletic and team work skills to help us on the big day!
- -In Art, we studied heraldry and designed our own heraldic symbols.

Year 4:

Year 4 have had another busy week. Here's a look at what we have been working on.

English: In English, we started our new book Odd and the Frost Giants. We made predictions based on our cover and made inferences about our new protagonist Odd, based on our initial chapters. We practised using and identifying the difference between plural and possessive -s.

Maths: We have started to explore shape this week. We learned compared different types of angles and also discussed and categorized equilateral, isosceles and scalene triangles. We have also been working hard on our timetables!

R.E: We discussed the importance of our church family and how our parish community can help us to be followers of Jesus.

French: We discussed our favourite hobbies and our schedules this week. We wrote paragraphs describing our weekly activities and what activities we are going to do in the near future.

History: We continued our exploration of the Anglo-Saxons and examined some of the artefacts discovered at Sutton Hoo.

Geography: We started our Mapquest journey this week. Using our maps and atlases, we learned about the continent of Europe, the different countries on the continent and also about the EU.

P.E: We developed our ball handling and passing skills along with our teamwork through a variety of different games.

Art: In art, we completed our national flowers, first sketching and completing them in watercolour. Well done everyone on a fantastic week. I hope you all enjoy the weekend. Miss McVeigh











Year 3:

Year 3 has had an extremely busy week learning about regions of the UK in Map Quest, worked hard in our assessments and, most importantly, preparing for their First Holy Communion. This week we have learnt:

- In Maths, we have completed our Naths assessments, showing off our skills we have learnt this year. We have also learnt how to tell the time on a digital clock.
- In English, we have created a detailed recount of Omar and Daniel's adventure across London.
- In RE, we learnt about the Pentecost. We thought deeply about how the apostles must have felt.
- In History, we looked at the Ancient Greek gods. We learnt about what they were prayed to for.
- In Art, we looked at the architecture of the Parthenon and made sketches from it.
- In PE, we practised our running skills in relay races.
- In Map Quest, we have learnt how to use an atlas, and used them to place major rivers and mountains on the UK. We also looked at the regions of the UK.







Year 2:

A huge well done to Year 2 who have completed the last week of their SATs assessments! They sat tests for Maths this week. We are so proud of the children who have worked very hard in the lead up. They have shown wonderful perseverance and tried their very best! We finished the week with a little bubble party on the roof! Here is what else the children have been up to:

In **English**, we have started a new text 'Bear and Bird'. We have been making inferences about the two main characters in the story, focussing on what they might be thinking and feeling.

In **Maths**, we have been telling the time. We have focused on telling time past the hour and to the hour. In **RE**, we continued to think about what happened during Pentecost. We created our own artwork inspired by religious artworks depicting the Pentecost. We thought about what symbols we could include to link with scripture

In **Science**, we learnt about the life cycle of a butterfly.

In **Geography**, we compared the geographical features of London and the seaside town of Tobermory.

In **Art**, we learnt about the life and work of J.M.W. Turner. We looked at how he uses colour in his watercolour paintings to create mood.

In **PSHE**, we thought about our needs as we grow and change. We identified how many of our needs change as we grow but some stay the same.

For **MapQuest**, we learnt the countries of the United Kingdom and their capital cities and we identified the bodies of water surrounding the UK. We also used an atlas and symbols to identify the key mountains and rivers of these countries.









Year 1:

We have had another busy and exciting week in Year 1. Miss Fyers, Ms Leclercq and myself were exceptionally proud of the children in their assembly. They worked so hard! This is what we have been learning:

English: We have been started a new new book called the Yeti and the Bird by Nadia Shireen. This week we have been focusing on using the conjunction 'because'. We have also been using commands to write a letter of advice to the Yeti to make new friends. We introduced the suffix 'est' to describe the Yeti.

Maths: In Maths this week we have continued our fractions topic. We recapped on halves and introduced quarters to the children.

History: In History we compared Mary Seacole with Florence Nightingale.

MapQuest: In our first week of MapQuest we have learnt about the continents: Asia, Europe, Africa, Australia (Oceania) and North America. We have been using Maps to locate the different continents and some countries within these continents. They have been learning about currency, flags, traditional food and additional information.

Religious Education: In RE this week we have been learning about our new topic of 'Miracles'. We retold the story of Jesus calming the sea of Gailee and discussed our own experience of when we turn to Jesus for help and support in times of need.

Science: In Science we have been conducting an experience where we are recording the weather over the next fortnight. The children learnt about weather symbols and how to read a weather report.

Reception:

Reception have had a great first week back and are looking forward to a busy final term in Reception!

Literacy: We have been reading our class text "The Rainbow Fish" where the children have been retelling the story and writing sentences to describe the rainbow fish.

Phonics: This week, we have been practising reading and writing consonant blends such as cross, green and train.

Maths: This week, the children have been practising using positional language and giving instructions.

UTW: Our focus this week has been on MapQuest and learning about the equator and the poles.

EAD: The children have enjoyed printing sparkling scales to make their own rainbow fish!

C&L: This week, the children have been using the role play area of the Travel Agents and the arctic table to use new language and knowledge of the world and the poles.

PD: The children have been playing listening and understanding games, where they had to follow the rules and work as a team.

PSED: This week, we used the story of the rainbow fish to discuss how to be a good friend.
