

What's been going on in class this week?

Year 6

It has been an extremely full week of special events for the Year 6 children! From Monday's roles helping during Infants Sports Day to Wednesday's Sponge the School Council to Thursday's Talent Show and finally Friday's Danceathon - there has been a lot going on! This has been in addition to the increased rehearsals for our school play.

English: Reading Focus: Windrush Child by Benjamin Zephaniah; Writing focus: drafting and editing Yearbook personal statements. Spelling focus: words ending in -ibly.

Maths: Fractions revision: adding and subtracting fractions, comparing fractions, adding and subtracting mixed numbers.

Science: Evolution & Inheritance: to identify how animals are adapted to suit their environment in different ways and that adaptation may lead to evolution.

RE: To identify the seven Sacraments; To understand what the Sacrament of Confirmation does for us. Computing: Identifying bugs in computer program algorithms and using coding programs to debug based on an intended outcome.

PE: Athletics

Art: Creating scenery for end of year production; Using felt and sewing techniques to create Owls for

Year 5

We have had a lovely week in Year 5. The children have been working hard at their learning. We have had an exciting week – the children found out the names of their Owlets and made lovely booklets in preparation for meeting the new Reception children. Here is what else Year 5 have been up to this week:

- **In Maths,** we have been making conversions using millimetres and millilitres and have been converting units of length.
- In English, we have been investigating the main character from our novel 'The Final Year,' through inferences and retrieval to write a detailed character description.
- **In History,** we have been comparing and contrasting maps from Tudor times and present day to investigate change over time.
- In Art, have created our own pieces of embroidery, inspired by Tudor fashion.
- In PSHE, we have been working so very hard on making our Owl and Owlet booklets. We are so excited to build a positive relationship with our new Owlets.
- In PE, we enjoyed playing dodgeball with our peers. In addition, we thoroughly enjoyed our danceathon on Friday!

Year 4:

Year 4 have had another jam-packed week of learning. We've also enjoyed all the wonderful events run by the amazing school council, especially our danceathon on Friday!

English: We continued reading our novel 'Odd and the Frost Giants', making some predictions as we reach our final chapter. We also have been coming up with ideas for our own picture books. We developed characters and character traits and discussed different structures and pacing. We have also started to map out and plan our spreads to fit our plot.

Maths: We started to learn about coordinates and positions of points on a grid. We plotted points to create 2D shapes and worked on translating them on our grids.

R.E: We discussed Jesus' mission for the disciples. We looked at Pope John Paul II and St Teresa of Calcutta and how they carried out their missions in their lives.

History: We learned about the features of Viking longships and what made them so essential to the Vikings in battle and in their exploration.

Science: We continued our learning of the digestive system. We conducted an experiment which replicates the mechanical and chemical digestion that takes place in the stomach.

P.S.H.E: We discussed some of the harmful effects of alcohol and addiction.

French: We learned about different types of transport. We used our vocabulary to describe holiday trips and how we come to school.

Year 3:

It has been a very busy, fun and dance-filled week for Year 3! This week we have learnt:

- In Maths, we have been able to identify and mark parallel and perpendicular lines. We also drew our own 2D shapes and described 3D shapes.
- In English, we have used Edward's experience in the rubbish dump to inspire sense poems.
- In RE, we discussed the significance of the Sacraments of Baptism, Reconciliation and the Eucharist.
- In Art, we created our own natural dyes using avocados, red cabbage, beetroot and turmeric. We used these dyes to dye swatches of cotton, and were delighted with the results.
- In Science, we explored how we can keep plants alive and healthy.
- In PE, we took a look at gymnastics. We learnt many different positions, rolls and jumps, and how to smoothly transition between them.





Year 2:

We have had a lovely week in Year 2! The children enjoyed their Sports Day at the beginning of the week, they had a wonderful time taking part in and watching Oratory's Got Talent and we have finished the week with lots of dancing! Here is what else we have been up to:

In **English**, we have finished writing persuasive letters to Bear to convince him why he should be honest with Bird. We have also been thinking about how Bird feels and whether he is starting to get suspicious of Bear.

In **Maths**, we have been consolidating our understanding of adding and subtracting two 2-digit numbers within and across 10. We have been tackling one-step and two-step word problems using addition and subtraction.

In **RE**, we looked at Peter's escape from prison. We roleplayed as Peter and Rhoda to reflect on how they must have felt and we recalled the events of the story.

In **Science**, we have been learning about the first steps in bulb growth and all about germination. We have set up an experiment to observe the growth of bulbs over time in our classroom.

In **Geography**, we identified and compared weather patterns in the UK and The Gambia. We wrote and read our own weather reports for London and Banjul.

In **Art**, we continued to experiment with colour using watercolour paints, drawing inspirations from the art of Alma Thomas and J.M.W Turner.







Year 1:

We have had an exciting week with Holland Park, our talent show and finishing today with our Dancathon! This is what we have been learning in our lessons:

Maths: This week we have been continuing to learn about numbers from 50 to 100. We have been focusing on tens and ones. We learnt how to find one more and one less of a given number and we enjoyed playing a game of bingo on Monday to help us read our numbers!

English: In English we have been using adjectives and onomatopoeia to describe a setting. We have been using thought bubbles and speech bubbles to describe what a character is thinking or saying. We have also been linking Mini enjoying to cook with his mother to our own experiences. We spoke about things we enjoy to do with our family.

Science: In Science we have been learning about habitats, weather patterns and seasonal changes in the Summer.

History: In History we learnt about Captain Scott.

Religious Education: In Religious Education we learnt about the first miracle that Jesus performed for his mother. We spoke about different ways that Jesus shows his love to us and ways we can show love to others too.

PE: We enjoyed our Sports day!
