
This week's theme: BELONGING

The children have been thoroughly enjoying their first few playtimes of the year together – catching up again, making new friends and helping everyone feel a sense of belonging to our Oratory community.










































Chaplain's Corner – Fr James

Harvest Collection for 'The Trussell trust' Friday 3rd October

The Trussell Trust support a nationwide network of food banks and provide emergency food and support to people locked in poverty, and campaign for change to end the need for food banks in the UK. In the UK, more than 14 million people are living in poverty including 4.5 million children. They support more than 1,200 food bank centres in the UK to provide a minimum of three days' nutritionally-balanced emergency food to people who have been referred in crisis, as well as support to help people resolve the crises they face.

On Friday 3rd October we will be holding a special harvest assembly with Fr James, and we are asking each child to bring a donation to the Trussell Trust. We will then need some kind parent helpers to take the food along to the collection centre after the assembly – so please do let Mrs Steinart know if you are able to help. 


















What's been going on in class this week?

Year 6

Year 6 have continued to work hard this week, approaching all their learning with maturity and focus and setting high expectations of themselves.

English: we continued our unit on traditional tales with a focus on characterisation. The children developed the character of a 'trickster' through the use of dialogue and powerful verbs, before writing a monologue in role as 'The Boy Who Tricked a Troll'.

Maths: Continuing with our unit on place value, we have used number lines to explore numbers to 10, 000, 000, used place value to understand numbers that are 10, 100 or 1000 times the size of numbers, and we have compared and ordered integers.

RE: we continued to explore the Kingdom of God, reading parables such as 'The Lost Sheep' to show that the Kingdom of God is for everyone, and 'The Good Samaritan' to teach the new commandment- to love everyone. We considered the ways in which we can share the good news of the KOG.

History: we discussed what it is to be a historian and the use of primary and secondary sources. Science: We began our topic on Electricity by reviewing what we already know and what we'd like to found out.

Latin: We learnt about the origins of Latin and how English (and many of the other languages spoken in our class) are influenced by Latin. We learnt how to introduce ourselves.











Year 5

It has been another wonderful week of learning in Year 5. Here is a snippet of what we have been up to this week:

In Maths this week, we have been focusing on place value. We have been looking at numbers to 10,000 and rounding to the nearest 10, 100 and 1,000.

In English, we continue to enjoy our new text 'Tales from the Carribean,' by Trish Cooke. This week we have been investigating the character 'Brer Anansi,' known as a trickster. We have used this investigation to write a well detailed and engaging character description.

In Science, we have started our topic on 'Living Things and their Habitats' by learning about the life process of reproduction in plants. We have been dissecting plants to investigate each part of a flower.

In RE, We are beginning to think about Creation in RE. We continued our discussion on the difference between scientific and theological truths and we used scripture to discuss this. We thoroughly enjoyed Fr James coming to support us with our learning.

In History, we have started our focus on the Ancient Egyptians in Topic. We have placed Ancient Egyptian civilisation on a timeline in relation to other periods.

In PE, we have enjoyed playing handball tournaments.

In Art, we used careful measuring to transfer a silhouette of Nefertiti onto card and began their mosaics. Have a lovely weekend, Miss Cornes, Miss Carmody and Miss Ffyon









Year 4:

Year 4 have had another busy week of learning. Here's a look at what we have focused on this week. English: We continued with our story Mac Barnett's retelling of the Billy Goats Gruff. We discussed persuasive writing features and wrote our own persuasive speeches in role.

Maths: We practised flexible partitioning of 4-digit numbers and increasing and decreasing numbers by 1, 10, 100 and 1,000.

R.E: Continuing our study of the Bible, we used Bibles to find different references and reflect on them. We also discussed God's call to Abram.

History: We discussed different reasons that the Roman's invaded Britain. We examined different artefacts and drew conclusions on why they were useful to the Romans.

Science: We examined the viscosity of different liquids in an experiment and discussed the properties of liquids.

P.S.H.E: We identified different strategies we can use to help regulate our emotions.

French: We learned the names of different body parts and practised using our new vocabulary in pairs.

P.E: We developed our passing and blocking skills during handball.

Art: Developing our understanding of Roman culture, we examined and drew different mosaics.

Well done to everyone on another wonderful week of learning. I hope you all have a restful weekend.

Year 3:

Year 3 have shown how hard they can work this week, they earned their first Golden Time! This week we have learnt:

- -In Maths, we have represented 3-digit numbers in different ways and worked on partitioned 3-digit numbers flexibly and non-flexibly.
- -In English, we have been researching rats for a non-chronological report. We have organised our work into paragraphs.
- -In RE, we thought about what we mean by 'The Church'. We discussed our own churches and how we feel a part of the community of 'The Church'.
- -In History, we looked at aerial photographs of Chelsea and maps of Chelsea to explore our local area further.
- -In PSHE, we discussed the Zones of Regulation. We filled our wellbeing toolboxes with strategies to support us in each zone.
- -In French, we looked at introducing ourselves and asking for someone's name.
- -In PE, we put into practise our skills from last week into a game of handball.
- -In Science, we used our knowledge of food groups and nutrition to create our own balanced meal.

-In Art, we spent time in our local area studying the buildings and made architectural sketches.







Year 2:

It has been another wonderful week of learning in Year 2. The children have been continuing to grasp the classroom routines with smiles and positivity and they have been focusing on their 'whole body listening'.

- -In **Maths** this week, we have been focusing on counting objects to 100. We have partitioned numbers into tens and ones using place value charts and part-whole models.
- -In **English,** we have been writing diary entries in the role of Rapunzel. We have also written our own potion poems, with a focus on using exciting adjectives to describe nouns.
- -In **Science**, we have been continuing to explore and compare the differences between things that are living, things that have lived and things that have never been alive. We continued to learn about the life processes that help us to identify this.
- -In **RE**, we have thought about Abraham being one of God's chosen people. We reflected on Abraham's trust in God, and God's promises he kept.
- -In **History**, we continued to explore the differences and similarities between Stuart London and Modern London.
- -In **PSHE**, we talked about the Zones of Regulation and thought about our different emotions. We put together a 'toolkit' of ways we can try to regulate our emotions when we find ourselves in each of the zones.
- -In **Art,** we started looking at the work of Joseph Albers and thinking about the relationship between colours.









Year 1:

Another busy and productive week in Year 1! This is what we have been learning this week:

English: In English we have had a very busy week. We started by acting out 'thought' and 'speech' bubbles to show what the characters in Little Red Riding Hood were saying. We then planned and wrote a retell of the story.

Maths: This week we continued with our place value topic. We matched numerals to their words, counted on using a number track and found on more of a given number. We played lots of games to help us learn. Geography: This week we learnt about the equator, northern and southern hemisphere. Using a globe and our maps we learnt about climate and where the equator is. We compared Africa with Antarctica.

Phonics: This week we played 'ck' bingo, we went on a sound hunt to find words ending with y making the 'ee' sound and practised our short vowel sounds.

Art: In Art we used pastels to create our Picasso inspired roosters.

Science: This week we focused on our facial features. We learnt about eye and hair colour and compared them to our friends.

RE: This week we learnt about the creation story. We learnt what God made on each of the seven days and had lots of fun creating 'creation hats' to show this.

Reception:

Reception have had a wonderful first full week in school! They have been busy completing activities around the classroom and settling into classroom routines.

Literacy: This week, the children have begun reading our class text "Super Milly and the Super School Day". We have focused on making predictions about the text and learning key vocabulary.

Phonics: This week, the children have focused on learning the single sounds – s,a,t,i

Maths: Our learning focus this week had been on matching and pairing. The children have practised this sorting skill through pictorial and real life representations.

UTW: This week, we have been learning about the weather. We have focused on recognising and naming the different weather types.

EAD: The children have been practising their painting skills, creating beautiful pictures of weather scenes. They have also gotten creative using loose parts to represent the weather.

PD: This week, we practised walking and the use of using space safely.

C&L: The children have been using key vocabulary from our class text in their discussions and in their play.

PSED: We have continued to focus on school rules and settling in routines.
