

Junior Carol Service

We would be grateful if some parents could volunteer to carry the heavy benches back to their original positions at the end of the service, please let your rep know if you can help.


Our Green Orators Eco Team

What's been going on in class this week?

Year 6

Another busy and productive week in Year 6: lots of great learning alongside preparations for the carol service next week.

PE: Due to the wet weather, Y6 took a break from Rugby and practised some Gymnastics this week.

English: We finished our unit of persuasive writing by composing appeals for people to rehome animals that served during WWI. Then, we started our Christmas visual literacy unit by watching the 'Christmas Truce' and making inferences about the characters. We began writing our letter home from the trenches, recounting the events of the Christmas Truce.

Maths: Multiplying fractions and mixed numbers by integers and by other fractions; dividing fractions by whole numbers

RE: We started our Christmas preparation by reflecting on the Annunciation and discussing how Mary's response to Angel Gabriel showed her love and faith in God. We explored the mystery of the Incarnation and what it means that God is truly man and truly human.

History: This week we used a variety of sources to learn about the life of Anne Frank and her time in hiding.

Science: Explaining why shadows have the same shape as the objects that cast them: creating shadow puppets and investing how to make the biggest and clearest shadow possible

Latin: To understand and translate infinitives and conjugate them into the third person

In Maths, we've been adding and subtracting fractions, including adding to and subtracting from a mixed number.


In RE, Year 5 has been learning about the true meaning of Christmas. They reflected on how Christmas celebrates love, kindness, and the birth of Jesus.

In PE, we've discovered the rules, teamwork, and skills needed to play, such as passing, tackling, and running with the ball. Through practice and games, we've worked together to improve our communication and strategy on the field.

In Design Technology, we prepared and cooked Egyptian stew. It was delicious!

In Art, we finished our attractive and informative sketchbook pages on Egyptian art.

Year 4:

Year 4 have been working hard once again this week across all areas.

English: We compiled a fantastic list of expanded noun phrases which we used to contrast the settings in our text. We learned about the present perfect tense and wrote a postcard in role based on our story.


Maths: We learned about factors when multiplying. We used arrays to understand factors and practised identifying factors and factor pairs.

R.E: We reflected on how Joseph trusted in God and the type of person he was. We spoke about what qualities of Joseph we should try and adopt when trusting in God.

Geography: We used a case study to examine the positive and negative impact of volcanoes and discussed how volcanoes can benefit the people who live near them.

Science: We explored pitch and amplitude, and drew different soundwaves to represent different sounds.

P.E: We really put our rugby skills into practice in lots of matches!



Year 3:

Year 3 have had a wonderful week!

This week Year 3 have learnt:

-In Maths, we consolidated our 5-10 times table learning from Year 2. We also looked at multiplying and dividing by 4.

-In English, we were inspired by our Christmas advert 'The Greatest Gift' to write a character description and diary entry in role as Dad.

-In RE, we reflected on the presence of the shepherds at the Nativity.


-In French, we learnt the names of school subjects in French.

-In Science, we learnt that magnets have two poles; like poles repel and opposite poles attract.

-In PSHE, we reflected on the rights we have as humans and as children.

-In DT, we finished our own kaleidoscopes.

-In PE, we worked on our rugby skills in a game situation.



Year 2:

What brilliant performances from Year 2 this week! We are so proud of the children for all of the hard work and effort that they put into their Nativity performances. Well done Year 2! Here is what else the children have been up to this week:

- In **English**, we wrote our own part of the story in which our own beasts went on wild journeys to find the Lonely Beast.
- In **Maths**, we have been continuing to add two 2-digit numbers with exchanging.
- In **RE**, we have reflected on how the shepherds may have felt when the angels appeared to them. We made our own stained glass windows showing the birth of Jesus.
- In **Science**, we have been learning about the different food groups. We thought about how we keep healthy and discussed the food groups you should eat more and less of.
- In **History**, we learnt about the importance of fire safety around the school



Year 1:

This week Year 1 shone brightly on stage during their Nativity performances, filling the hall with festive cheer, big smiles, and plenty of proud moments. We are so proud of their hard work and teamwork to produce such a wonderful performance. Alongside all the practising, this is what else we have been learning:

History: In History we have been comparing the past to present day. Looking at Lyme Regis in the 1800, 1900s and in current day to find similarities and differences and to find out what life was like when Mary Anning was alive.

Maths: In Maths we have been continuing to learn about 2D and 3D shapes. We played a game to identify and sort 2D shapes into groups.

Literacy: In Literacy we have been writing our own instructions to make terrible soup! Using instructional language and commands we created a creative recipe using adjectives and nouns.

Religious Education: In RE we learnt about how the Shepherds were chosen to celebrate the birth of Jesus and we retold the Nativity story.

Art: In Art we created our hats ready for children's day.

Phonics: In Phonics we have started to learn about trigraphs and explored words containing 'air'.

Reception have had a very busy week practising for the Nativity. We are very proud of all the work they put in and their amazing performances!

Phonics: This week, we have been reading and writing longer words such as "sunset" "picnic".

Maths: We have continued to consolidate understanding of number composition to numbers to 5.

RE: We have continued discussing the Nativity story and reading our Advent books.

PD: The children have been practising their throwing and catching skills in PE and have continued to work on their handwriting.
